League of Women Voters' Information-Packed Guide to the Municipal Elections is Now Available
Pick Up a Nonpartisan Voter Guide at a Library Near You or Get it Online

TULSA—The League of Women Voters of Metropolitan Tulsa has released its nonpartisan, information-packed guide to the upcoming municipal elections.

An invaluable resource for voters, the guide lists the candidates for seven of the nine city council districts along with their contact information and their answers to a League questionnaire. Councilors for Districts 1 and 5 were chosen in the primary so are not included in the guide.

The guide also provides voters with simplified explanations of the four Tulsa city charter change proposals on the ballot. An insert details the League's opposition to those four proposals.

On its cover, the guide details the new Voter ID requirements and on page two includes the new city council district map.

The League has printed 5,000 copies of this go-to resource for voters. They are distributed mainly through the Tulsa City-County Library system (3,000). The other 2,000 are distributed to local organizations, agencies and individuals who request them. Call 918-747-7933 for more information.
