**League of Women Voters Releases Voters' Guide for November 4<sup>th</sup> General Election**

*For the first time, the Guide will be produced in Spanish through a partnership with YWCA Tulsa and the Charles and Lynn Schusterman Family Foundation*

**Tulsa, OK** – Voters in Tulsa can prepare for the upcoming general election by using the Voters' Guide created by the League of Women Voters. This publication is an all-inclusive guide to the general election; it includes voting information, responses from candidates, and background on the three state questions that appear on the ballot.

The Guide is now available online via [Vote411.org](http://Vote411.org). Beginning Thursday, Oct. 23, it will be distributed in print via the Tulsa City-County Library system.

“Educated and informed voters are the key to our democracy,” said Kathleen Kastelic, President of the League of Women Voters of Metropolitan Tulsa. “The League works all year, every year, to encourage all eligible voters to participate in our political system. It is so exciting that, due to new partnerships, our Guide will reach more voters than ever this year.”

New this year is a Spanish-language version of the guide, which will be distributed online via the YWCA and LWV websites, as well as in print at the Martin Regional Library and at some Latino-owned businesses. Translation of the Guide into Spanish was completed by the YWCA.

“At our National Voter Registration Day event, one of the students in our English class approached us and explained that she didn't vote because feel informed enough, due to the lack of electoral information available in Spanish,” said YWCA CEO Vanessa Finley. “We're so grateful to be able to reach thousands more voters through the translated guide.”
