### **League of Women Voters Releases Non-Partisan Guide to School Board Elections**

**TULSA**—The League of Women Voters of Metropolitan Tulsa has released its non-partisan, information packed voters' guide for the Feb. 11, 2014, Tulsa County School Board elections. The guide is available at [lwvtulsa.org](http://lwvtulsa.org) or voters can get personalized ballot information at [vote411.org](http://vote411.org).

"We are pleased to have responses from the vast majority of candidates in competitive races," said Kathleen Kastelic, Tulsa League of Women Voters president. "This, we hope, is a testament to the League's ability to reach and inform voters through our voters' guides which present the candidates in their own words. We neither edit nor correct spelling or grammar in responses so the voter can get a genuine sense of the candidates."

The voters' guide includes biographical information and answers to relevant questions posed by the League of Women Voters from candidates in Tulsa School Board, districts 4 and 7; Bixby School Board, office 4; and Tulsa Technology Board, zone 6, office 6. The guide also includes the Jenks and Union school boards' ballot proposition language for their respective bond issues that are on the Feb. 11 ballot for voters in those areas.

Thirteen school board candidates will be elected by acclamation, and their names will not appear on any ballot, because only one candidate filed for each respective office. These offices spread through Tulsa County from Keystone in the west to Collinsville in the east. No candidate filed for Union School Board, office 4. The Union School board will appoint a member to fill that seat at its first regular meeting after the election.
