ERROR IN LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS GUIDE TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

TULSA—The League of Women Voters of Metropolitan Tulsa’s printed guide to the upcoming municipal elections misidentifies the candidates for City Council District 6.

On p. 10 of the printed guide, the first candidate listed should be Robert Gwin, Jr., Democrat, and the second candidate should be Byron “Skip” Steele, Republican. The photographs, contact information and question responses are in the correct location on the page, only the names and party affiliations were transposed.

The League unfortunately did not learn of the mistake until after 3,000 of the printed guides had been distributed through the Tulsa City-County Library system. We have replaced the guides at the Martin East Regional Library, in the heart of council district 6, with corrected guides. We have also corrected the remaining 2,000 guides that are currently being distributed across the city.

We have expressed our apologies to the two candidates and are taking steps to tighten our internal processes so an error like this does not happen again.

About the Voter Guide

An invaluable resource for voters, the guide lists the candidates for seven of the nine city council districts along with their contact information and their answers to a League questionnaire. Councilors for Districts 1 and 5 were chosen in the primary so are not included in the guide.

The guide also provides voters with simplified explanations of the four Tulsa city charter change proposals on the ballot. An insert details the League’s opposition to those four proposals.

On its cover, the guide details the new Voter ID requirements and on page two includes the new city council district map.
