#### **Overview of Year's Activities (goals, activities, events, challenges, etc.)**

##### **Goals:**

- Increase number of voter registration events, especially within areas and populations with historically low voter turnout
- Develop tools to increase voter engagement

##### **Activities and Events:**

- 164 voters registered through 31 events
  - Additional 29 voter registration forms with postage were handed out
- Published pre-recorded candidate forum for school board candidates
- Hosted and facilitated in-person candidate forum for school board district 7 with TYPROs
- Created and published Voter Registrar Training Video
  - Complements online voter registration event kit requests
  - Special thank you to Mary Jane Lindaman for being our narrator!
- Participated in Owasso Senior Conference
  - Annual recurring event educating and registered high school seniors
- Created zip code map of eligible voters registered

##### **Challenges:**

- Difficulty engaging public schools for registration events

### **Recommendations**

- Build out calendar of recurring voter registration events to maximize planning efforts
- Continue to partner and co-host to increase the League's presence in the community
- Develop pool of forum candidate forum moderators and volunteers to increase responsiveness to requests
- Develop committee recruitment plan to better represent the populations and areas with low voter registration and turnout
