Local Conservationist Honored at 7th Annual Pathfinder Award Gala

League of Women Voters Recognizes Ken Greenwood for His Community Leadership

TULSA—The League of Women Voters of Metropolitan Tulsa will honor conservationist and businessman **Ken Greenwood** at its 2010 Pathfinder Award dinner and auction Tuesday, October 5, at the Oklahoma Jazz Hall of Fame.

Greenwood has blazed conservation trails throughout Tulsa and eastern Oklahoma. As general manager of KRMG Radio, one of Greenwood's earliest projects was the creation of The Great Raft Race to bring attention to the Arkansas River. He was part of the founding team for the Oklahoma Chapter of The Nature Conservancy where he raised funds for the creation of the Tallgrass Prairie Preserve. Greenwood is also a founder of NatureWorks, sponsor of the country's last major wildlife art show and funder for the bronze animal sculptures scattered throughout the community. NatureWorks supports and sponsors conservation projects throughout the area with proceeds from its annual art show.
